Thanks to our first year of funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), we were able to commence our service delivery through Prosper working as a consortium with 4 other organisation's across Northern Ireland. This funding has provided a strong foundation for us to expand our reach, deepen our impact, and work closely with employers to highlight the immense potential of a more inclusive workforce whilst reducing economic inactivity.

Our partnerships with Labour Market Partnerships (LMPs) through Councils have been another important focus this year. These collaborations have allowed us to deliver tailored initiatives that connect individuals with disabilities to local employment opportunities while addressing the specific needs of employers. By working together, we've helped to break down barriers and open doors for those who are often furthest removed from the labour market. At a time when businesses are facing challenges in finding talent, we've been proud to showcase the value and contributions that people with disabilities can bring to workplaces across all sectors.

These successes would not have been possible without the trust and commitment of our funders, partners, and the incredible employers who share our vision of inclusion, thank you so much. I want to take a moment to recognise the heart of our organisation: our trainees and clients. Your courage, determination, and achievements inspire us every day and remind us of the importance of our mission. Also to our fantastic staff team for your unwavering passion and belief in the work that we do that changes lives everyday.

Looking ahead, there is still much to do, but we are excited about the opportunities that lie ahead. ### OUR YEAR IN REVIEW

#### **Services**

During 2023/24 our services continued to thrive with continued support from new funders, employers and stakeholders. We continued to deliver and build on our quality services that support people with barriers to learning and employment to develop new skills, qualifications and employment.

Our 'BE IN Work' employment academies funded through Prosper supported 112 people into employment with participants gaining 293 accredited qualifications. The Employment Service delivered its services under the UK Shared Prosperity funded, PROSPER programme.

This was the first year of funding from UKSPF as we transitioned from European Social Fund working in partnership with 4 other organisation's across Northern Ireland.

We also secured the contracts for two new Labour Market Partnerships with Armagh Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council and Lisburn and Castlereagh City Council with excellent results.

The Lisburn and Castlereagh City Council LMP supported 24 people with 23 achieving qualifications and 9 gaining paid employment. The Armagh, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council LMP resulted in 57 people recruited onto the programme with 49 completing and 22 people into paid employment.

Our training service reached 185 participants working with business partners though bespoke academies and community groups throughout Northern Ireland, delivering 359 qualifications in total.

#### **Youth Service**

Our Youth Service directly supported 17 young people aged 16-24 delivering 39 qualifications with 8 young people progressing to further education and training, 7 supported into work placements and 3 young people achieving pad employment.

#### **Social Enterprises**

79 people with a learning disability engaged in training and activities through our six Social Enterprises.

Our first cohort of 5 young people commenced the OCNNI Level 1 in Horticulture at Navigation House. We also started trading activity at Navigation House this year. We opened our garden shop to the public, released horticulture workshops and opened the site for room hire and event bookings.

We also rolled out a well-being programme that included Yoga, exercise classes, mindfulness and outdoor physical activities including walking and cycling groups for people with a disability.

#### Living Life Loving Life and ASDAN

This programme supported 24 people with learning disabilities to improve their social skills, communication, employability and confidence through fun relevant activities. Participants also had the opportunity to gain accredited qualifications in everyday life topics such as, independent travel, basic money management and the world around us.

#### **Stepping Stones NI Football Team**

10 football enthusiasts engage in weekly training that brings together physical activity and essential life skills such as teamwork, discipline, and perseverance. The team took part in a number of tournaments including the George Best Community Cup.
